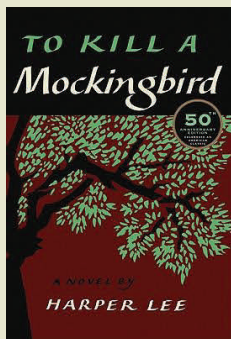

Harper Lee was born in 1926 in Monroeville, Alabama, where she attended Huntingdon College and studied law at the University of Alabama. She has received many literary awards.

In 2007 Lee was a recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom, America’s highest civilian honor, from President George W. Bush.
