Historical Note:

Organized in 1927, many of The Ipswich Garden Club's early members were summer residents who wished to improve their own gardening skills. But their focus soon broadened; in 1929 members planted trees at a school and the Club became a charter member of the Garden Club Federation of Massachusetts. In 1932, membership was limited to 40 women who joined by invitation.

By 1930 the Club adopted its first bylaws, its motto "Rien sans Peine" [Nothing without hard work], and began work at the Whipple House, one of Ipswich's historic houses. Indeed, in the 1930s, Club members undertook to "serve the town as well as themselves," and adopted a work requirement that "an active member must cheerfully undertake any task given her by the president." In addition to lectures and exhibitions members soon devoted themselves to conservation and town beautification efforts: they joined the Committee to Abolish Billboards, planted around and painted the Boston & Maine Railroad station, successfully lobbied for the creation of a town Conservation Commission, and held an open meeting on town planning. And, in 1935, members voted to increase their number to 45 and held their first evening meeting to which men were invited.

With the coming of World War II, summer residents were unable to come to Ipswich and some resigned. Members considered disbanding, but, instead, invited more local people to join and resolved to "Plant wisely with an eye to doing our part in a great united effort." They also began visits to the Chelsea Naval Hospital.

Following the war, the Club continued town beautification efforts: with the Ipswich Historical Society they created 17th Century Day, planted trees and placed planters around town, worked at the Town Wharf, and worked cooperatively with the Town and Country Garden Club on the dunes at

Crane's Beach and worked, once again, on plantings at the High School. They continued work at the Whipple House and Hall Haskell House, and, with the deaths of some early members, created memorial gardens at the Public Library and elsewhere in town.

In 1971 the Club held its first plant sale, the proceeds from which were used to buy teachers' handbooks for the"People and their Environment "project. Their plant sales continue to attract townspeople.

Perhaps one of their most ambitious efforts was the creation of a memorial garden at the site of the South Parish Church which burned in 1977 for which they received the Marie Lewis Conservation of Natural Resources award in 1982. Other conservation efforts included sponsoring the town's first Household Hazardous Waste Day, and, when the town's budget was cut in 1991, members worked on the Riverwalk and around Sally's Pond.

But public service came at a price. In 1989, the Club voted to require 6 hours per year from active members which requirement was increased to 10 hours in 1993. Shortly thereafter, ten members were warned that they had failed to meet the requirement. Internal policy disagreements came to a head in 1995 when the resignations of four members caused the entire board to resign their offices. An interim board then sent comprehensive questionnaires to the remaining members, which helped clarify the Club's purposes. Bylaws were changed to "welcome anyone who has expressed interest . . . who has attended two meetings," but was still limited to 50. The bylaws as well as committee reports were printed and distributed to members.

Scope and Content:

The records of The Ipswich Garden Club, Inc. provide information about one of the significant women's organizations in Ipswich from its founding in 1927 to the present. The records describe the governance, activities, and history of the organization, provide plans and more detailed information about some the Club's community projects, and give a sense of the changing role women, whether summer or year-long residents, and women's organizations played in Ipswich.

The Ipswich Garden Club records are arranged in the following series:

Series I *Histories*, 1971, 1977, 2002, includes three unpublished histories written by members, the first two in the 1970s, one for the fiftieth anniversary of the Club's founding, and the third covering the next twenty-five years of the Club's history from 1977 to 2002.

Series II *Governance* is divided into five subseries: By-laws, Policies and Procedures, Minutes, Treasurer, and Nominating Committee:

By-laws, 1932-1968, is self-explanatory. By-laws, and perhaps, an explanation of any changes also can be found in the Minutes subseries.

Policies and procedures date only from 1978 and are not comprehensive. Additional policies and procedures are likely to be found in the Minutes and Nominating Committee subseries, and in the Publicity series.

Minutes, 1927-2001/2002, are much more than the minutes of the annual meeting and board meetings. After World War II on, the minutes contain committee reports, correspondence, newsletters, and any other records that the Club considered significant in describing the year's operations. Indeed, when Ostberg wrote the Club's history for 1977-2002, she continued that arrangement. This arrangement has been left intact.

Treasurer accounts, 1928-1969, were originally ledgers that provide receipts and expenditures and include members' names. Since 1969 Treasurer's reports have been included with Minutes. Nominating Committee, 1978-1995, underscore how TIGC operated for many years with potential members nominated by and supporting letters written by current members. It also includes the 1995 member questionnaire and responses when the Club was undergoing restructuring.

Series III *Programs*, 1931-1999/2000, contains program cards for almost the entire period. The cards typically included the meeting schedule, and names and contact information for officers, committees, and members. In addition, there are two written presentations about lilies dating from 1934 and given by Katherine B. Taylor and Mrs. Richard M. Smith; seven handouts relating to gardening and dating from the 1980s and 1990s; examples of award ribbons, and award won by individual members or the Club from the 1930s to 1970s; and book plates showing the Club's logo.

Series IV *Projects* – Community, Beautification, Conservation, 1933-2001, is less comprehensive than the date range suggests. There are plans, reports, and correspondence for some projects undertaken by the Club. Undoubtedly more information can be gleaned from the Minutes.

Of some interest may be the few letters from the 1930s relating to town planning; and the High School planting with plans created by noted architect ?? Shurcliff in 1938. Robert L. Goodale's tree inventory sheets, with listings by street address, from the mid 1970s are here as well as the report he prepared and cassette tapes of the presentation. One of the best documented projects is the South Parish effort of the late 1970s – the award application includes a description, clippings, and photographs.

Series V *Publicity*, 1936-1947, 1956-1998, contains news clippings about the Club and its activities. Many were originally in two scrapbooks. They have been photocopied with the original rough chronological order retained. Both scrapbooks included a few photographs which have been left with the clippings but either separated with acid-free paper or encapsulated. There also was a Publicity Notebook covering the years 1977-1985 that probably was maintained by the Publicity Committee chair providing committee and chair descriptions, by-laws, suggestions, notes, and the 50th anniversary report. Also included in this series are photographs that were in envelopes placed loose in the front of one of the scrapbooks. The photographs, dating from the 1990s, have been encapsulated and identified.

Community garden club organized in 1927 by full-time and summer residents of Ipswich, MA. Membership, by invitation, was originally limited to 40 women. Charter member of MA Federation of Garden Clubs. In addition to lectures, plant sales and exhibits, the Club began to participate in conservation initiatives and town beautification efforts, including planting gardens at the Whipple House and the Hall Haskell House, town schools, parks and town squares. One of its most successful efforts was the landscaping of the Old South Parish Church site. Membership now limited to 50.

Records include minutes, financial records, annual programs, lists of officers and members, correspondence as well as plans, photographs and clippings of press coverage of principal projects. **\$b** Included, too, are copies of the 1995 questionnaires and responses which resulted in the reorganization of the Club.
