



Birds of Prey Come to Town Hall for Children's Program

Jim Parks of WINGMASTERS brought 5 live birds of prey to Town Hall for a program organized by the Children's librarians on April 20th. The program taught children about predation in the animal kingdom, the birds' place at the top of the food web, their different hunting adaptations, and their status in a rapidly changing world. Because many birds of prey are declining in number, this presentation also featured endangered raptors native to New England that WINGMASTERS cares for and explained why these species face an uncertain future.






IPL Book Clubs
