

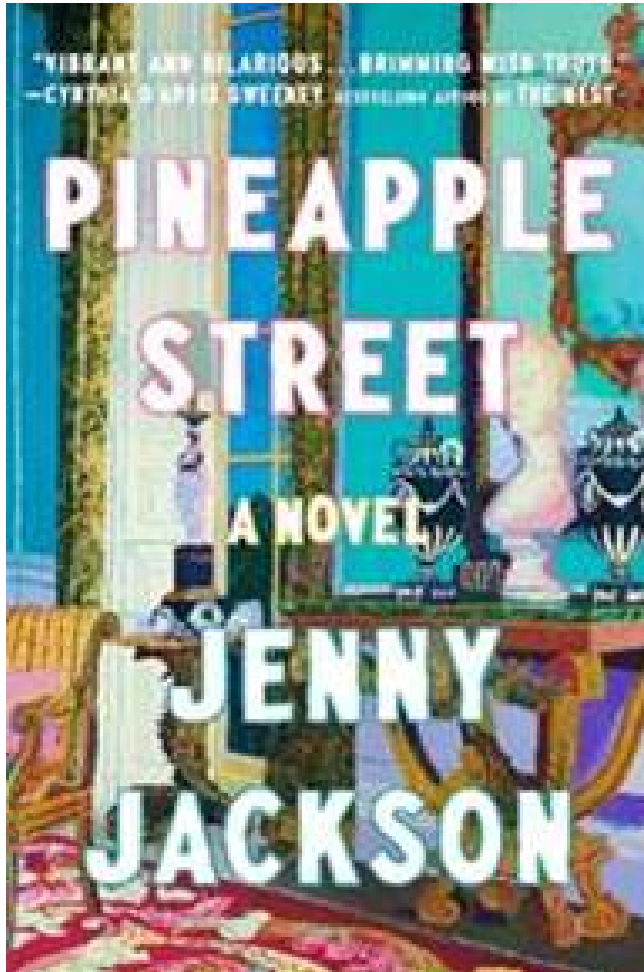

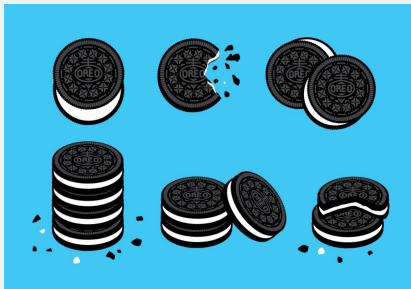
Teen Candy BINGO: One Piece Adventure

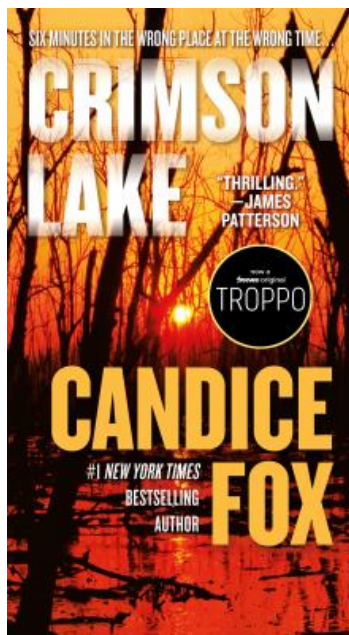

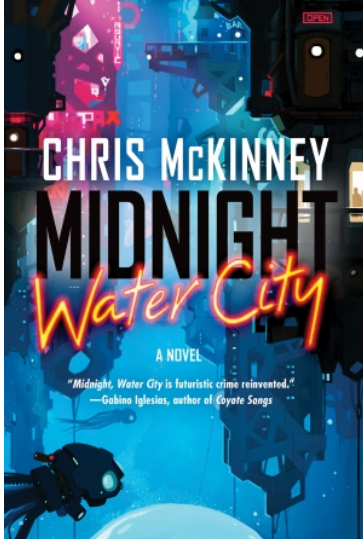

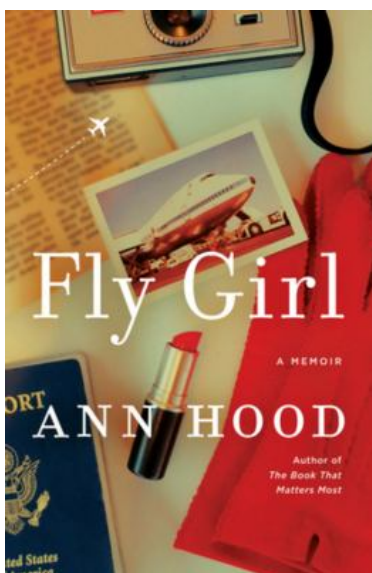
